





Party Structure

- The Senate Districts are based on the 31 members of the Senate, representing single-member districts across the state of Texas, with populations of approximately 806,000 per constituency, based on the 2010 U.S. Census.
- Harris County has 8 Senate Districts. Senate Districts 4, 6, 7, 11, 13, 15, 17, 18.

Precincts

- A precinct is the smallest political subdivision in Texas.
- 1012 Precincts in Harris County
- Boundaries are drawn by the Commissioners Court based on registered voters.
- Precincts are organized by Precinct Chairs, who are supposed to register voters and help get out the vote. They are not necessarily Precinct Judges for Elections, though they can be.
- Precincts are "housed" within Senate Districts for County Party Business.
- Precinct Chairs can recruit Block Captains to help organize their precinct.

Precinct Chair Duties

- Organizing their precinct
- Mobilize voters and get them to the polls
- Bridging the gap between voters and elected officials
- Finding election judges for elections
- Plugging volunteers into county-wide efforts and local campaigns
- Encouraging primary voters to attend senate district conventions
- Serving on the County Executive Committee

How to become a Precinct Chair

- Look up if there is a chair currently
- https://harrisdemocrats.org/find-my-precinct/
- If there is then file to be on the ballot the next cycle
- If vacant, fill out the interest form found on the HCDP website
- Senate District Vacancy Chair will contact
- Sworn in at the next CEC if approved

County Executive Committee

- Consists of the County Chair and the Precinct Chairs
- They elect a Secretary and Treasurer
- Conduct business on behalf of the county party
- Can include, filling places on the ballot after filing deadlines have passed.

Senate District Steering Committee

- Conducts business on behalf of the Senate Districts
- Usually consists of the Chair, Secretary, Male and Female SD Executive Committee persons and other committee people as the chair sees fit.
- Appoints Senate District Members (not necessarily precinct chairs) to standing county committees.
- Duties include recruiting precinct chairs and training them in their duties
- Duties also include setting up Senate District Conventions
- The Chair, Secretary, and SDEC members that live in Harris County also serve on the Steering Committee for the Harris County Democratic Party.

- •Monday, Feb. 3 Iowa caucuses (49 delegates)
- •Tuesday, Feb. 11 New Hampshire primaries (33 delegates)
- •Saturday, Feb. 22 Nevada Democratic caucuses (48 delegates)
- •Saturday, Feb. 29 South Carolina Democratic primaries (63 delegates)
- •Super Tuesday, March 3 Alabama primaries (59 delegates), Arkansas primaries (36 delegates), California primaries (495 delegates), Colorado primaries (80 delegates), Maine primaries (32 delegates), Massachusetts primaries (114 delegates), Minnesota primaries (91 delegates), North Carolina primaries (122 delegates), Oklahoma primaries (42 delegates), Tennessee primaries (73 delegates), Texas primaries (262 delegates), Utah primaries (35 delegates), Vermont primaries (23 delegates), Virginia Democratic primary (124 delegates)

Delegates

- This is who you support to be the Democratic nominee
- Delegates are assigned by proportion of the vote.
- A candidate must get 15% of the vote to get a delegate
- If you have a favorite candidate then contact their campaign to help
- Delegates come from the Senate Districts to the State Convention
- Early voting starts Feb 18th

Joint Senate District Convention

- JSD Convention: March 21, 2020
- Location: George R Brown Convention Center
- Must be a registered voter for credentials
- Not voted in the Republican Primary
- Select delegates to the State Convention (done in Senate District Caucuses)
- Vote on Resolutions to build the Party Platform

Texas State Convention

- June 5-6, 2020
- Henry B. Gonzales Convention Center
- San Antonio, TX
- Select Delegates to the National Convention
- Various Caucuses
- Vote on SDEC members
- State Party Platform

Democratic National Convention

- July 13-16, 2020
- Milwaukee, Wisconsin
- Create the National Platform
- Select the Democratic Nominee for President

County Commissioner Precinct 3 (Radack) & **Harris County** Department of Education Position 4 **Precinct 3** (Duhon)




