

Bill goes to the President to be signed into law

Or Vetoed

Entered into the Federal Register



Special Processes

- The Budget Process
- Reconciliation only fiscal, no policy (Byrd Rule)
- Appropriations Omnibus Bill during Regular Order
- Continuing Resolution doing what we did
- Privileged (Impeachment, etc....)



The Senate

- Requires unanimous consent to run
- Sixty votes required for Cloture
- Blue slips* used in the judicial appointment process
- Treaty approval requires 2/3 vote
- Can't originate a revenue bill*



OVERSIGHT

- Supposed to review Administration actions
- Supposed to question Admin Officials about policy
- Review spending items and directives

The State Legislature

- Session is 140 days every two years
- 150 Members of the House and 31 in the Senate
- Governor has the power to call a Special Session limited to specific areas
- Sessions can be BRUTAL
- Sine die adjournment (sometimes the best move is no move)




Control of Redistricting matters
